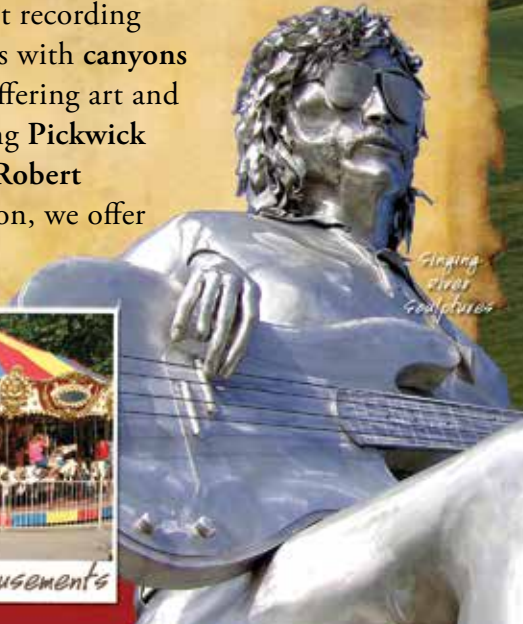

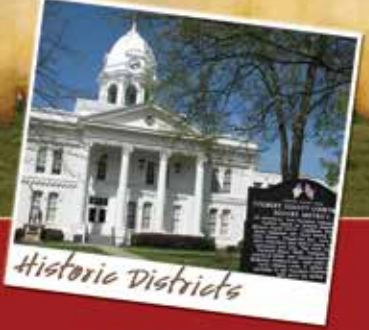

### Alabama Music Hall of Fame

 The outstanding achievements and the music of Alabamians are presented in this state museum. "Father of the Blues" W.C. Handy, "Father of Rock and Roll" Sam Phillips and Percy Sledge ("When a Man Loves a Woman"), all Shoals natives, are among the prestigious inductees. You'll hear rocking rhythms and soul touching melodies as you admire the vast memorabilia from the lives and careers of more than 1,000 stars, representing all styles of America's music. ### Muscle Shoals Sound Studio

3614 Jackson Highway, Sheffield  
 Established in 1969 by a group of former FAME session musicians, this was the location where the Rolling Stones, Cher, Bob Segar, Rod Stewart, Paul Simon, Art Garfunkle, and many others created some of the most popular hits of the 1970's. The rhythm section was eventually immortalized as "The Swampers" by Lynyrd Skynyrd in the lyrics to "Sweet Home Alabama." (256) 394-3562. ### FAME Recording Studios

 FAME, established in 1959, was the first successful, professional recording studio in Alabama. Arthur Alexander's 1961 hit, "You Better Move On," cut here, launched the famous Muscle Shoals sound. The internationally acclaimed documentary, "Muscle Shoals" released in 2013, told the story of FAME and its' founder, Rick Hall. Releases from FAME have sold over 300 million copies world-wide.  The dramatic life and times of Helen Keller are preserved at her birthplace and childhood home, Ivy Green. The plantation home and birthplace cottage, dating back to the 1820's, are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Original furnishings of the Keller family decorate the home and museum, highlighted by hundreds of Miss Keller's personal mementos, books and gifts from her lifetime of travel and lectures for the betterment of the world's blind and deaf-blind. 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# Historic Treasures



Colbert County Courthouse

## Historic Tuscumbia

One of Alabama's Best

Collections of 19th century architecture from the antebellum period. The town of Tuscumbia is centered by its quaint downtown, which includes the majestic Colbert County Courthouse, a restored train depot, early churches and many historic homes. More than 50 buildings remain from the Antebellum period. A 6-block area along Main Street holds some of Alabama's earliest commercial buildings, including the Sutherland Building and Commercial Row. The south end of Main Street culminates at Spring Park, site of the town's founding (c.1817). Chickasaw Chief Tuscumbia was honored by early white settlers in the naming of the town. National Register Historic District. Specialty shops and restaurants now occupy many of these historic buildings.

## Historic Sheffield

North Montgomery Avenue with its wide, tree-lined streets is the setting for many historic homes in Sheffield. The city was incorporated in 1885 and soon after, fine Victorian homes were built, followed by large, craftsman style bungalows. National Register Historic District. Specialty shops, restaurants, and entertainment venues now occupy many buildings in the historic commercial district.

## Village One - Sheffield

This planned community of 85 bungalows, barracks, school, and parks was built as government defense housing in 1918. The streets were laid out in an unusual Liberty Bell design. The houses feature red tile roofs and stucco exteriors. National Register Historic District.

## Belle Mont Mansion

1569 Cook Lane, Tuscumbia

One of early Alabama's crowning architectural achievements, this is one of the most outstanding Palladian-style houses in the Deep South. The mansion has a raised, two-story central section with flanking, one-story wings and a U-shaped floor plan that embraces a courtyard. (256) 381-5052. ## LaGrange College Site Park

1491 LaGrange College Rd., Leighton

Established in 1830 as Alabama's first college, LaGrange became known as "The West Point of the South." In 1863, the college was destroyed by Union forces. A pioneer village has been recreated at the site to include a welcome center and museum, chapel, and Log Cabin B&B. [www.lagrangehistoricsite.com](http://www.lagrangehistoricsite.com). ## Tuscumbia Railway Depot & Museum

204 W. 5th St., Tuscumbia

This 1888 restored passenger depot was utilized by both the Memphis and Charleston and Southern Railway companies. Today, it is a museum dedicated to its' memorabilia. Tuscumbia boasts the first railroad west of the Appalachian Mountains. (256) 389-1357. Admission.

## Tennessee Valley Museum of Art

511 North Water St., Tuscumbia

This regional art center is a venue for cultural activities. Galleries provide annual and rotating exhibits as well as workshops for adults and children.

The permanent exhibition of the Martin Petroglyph, a 3,000 pound boulder with carvings completed by prehistoric people, is on display in a replicated bluff shelter setting. # Hiking, Biking, Birding, & Outdoor Adventure

## CANE CREEK CANYON NATURE PRESERVE

A 700-acre, privately owned, scenic, natural area organized around a complex of small canyons with rugged topography, including a number of waterfalls, boulder fields and Native American rock shelters. Open year-round to the public for hiking and other outdoor recreational activities. 15 miles of maintained hiking trails lead the hiker to scenic canyon overlooks, rich wildflower area, creek cascades and other attractions. The purpose of the preserve is to protect this unique and biologically diverse natural area for educational activities, ongoing scientific study and public recreational use. Hours: Daylight, year round. Trail maps available on site.

## Trail Riding Seven Springs Lodge

This facility offers horseback trail riding. Organized equestrian group trail rides held throughout the 3,500 acres of meadow and woodland, dotted with waterfalls and caves.

## NATURE WALKS & CYCLING

Several miles of hiking, walking, jogging and biking trails are available to the public on the TVA Reservation located in Muscle Shoals and Sheffield. A six mile-bike trail through historic downtown Sheffield is accessible from N. Montgomery Ave. Fifteen miles of hiking trails are maintained in Cane Creek Canyon Nature Preserve, west of Tuscumbia.

## Old Railroad Bridge

2100 Ashe Blvd., Sheffield  
This pedestrian bridge is 1,580 feet long and 14 feet high. The pier dates back to 1832, the superstructure to 1903. The original bridge opened in 1839 as a toll bridge with trains crossing on the upper deck while wagons, pedestrians and livestock crossed over the bottom.

## Riverfront Park

1416 Alabama Avenue, Sheffield  
This park boasts one mile of inviting shoreline on Pickwick Lake. Variety of recreation available, including boat launch, fishing piers, docking facilities, picnicking, walking trails, splash pad, playground and restrooms.

## BIRDING

The northwest loop of the North Alabama Birding Trail boasts more than a dozen sites located primarily in the Shoals area. Several sites are noted for their impressive congregations of winter birds – waterfowl, eagles, gulls – as well as a long list of rare or vagrant species to the state. Leighton Ponds, with its assemblage of flooded sinkholes, is one of Alabama's best interior sites for shorebird migration. The Natchez Trace Parkway with its wooded, scenic byway offers Barred Owls and Wild Turkey. Another site on the historic Trace, Rock Springs, is renowned for its concentration of fall migrating hummingbirds. These sites and more make for great birding in the Shoals area. ## Whippoorwill Park

This 44-acre, wooded park is accessed within the historic downtown residential district and was laid out in the original town of Sheffield in 1884. Home to many species of wild flowers and plants, it is a bird sanctuary. Vietnam Memorial on site.

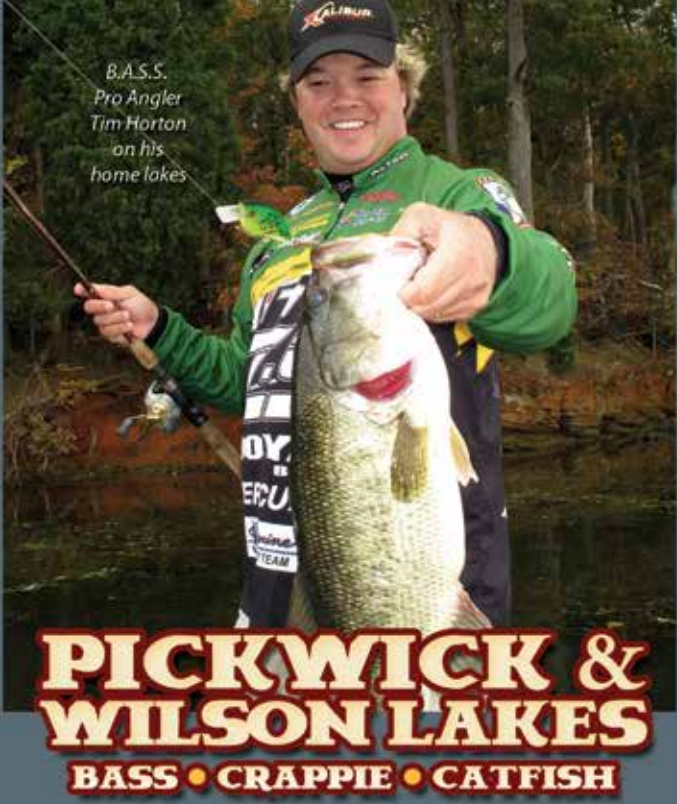

# PICKWICK & WILSON LAKES

BASS • CRAPPIE • CATFISH

The Muscle Shoals area offers some of the best fishing opportunities in the nation with well-known Pickwick and Wilson Lakes! The lakes were formed beginning in the 1930s when the Tennessee Valley Authority began construction of a series of massive dams along the Tennessee River in North Alabama. This unique combination of the nature-made deep channel of the river and the man-made reservoirs of flooded fields, bluffs and marsh areas has generated excellent habitats for a large variety of game fish.

Pickwick impounds 30,175 acres of water along the Tennessee River, stretching 46 miles between Muscle Shoals, Ala., and Pickwick Landing, Tenn. Fishing conditions include shallow stump flats, well-defined channels, active feeder creeks, steeply falling bluffs, rocky ledges and long grassbeds. **WILSON LAKE**  
Wilson impounds 15,930 acres of water along the Tennessee River, stretching 15 miles between Wilson Dam at Muscle Shoals, Ala. and Rogersville's Wheeler

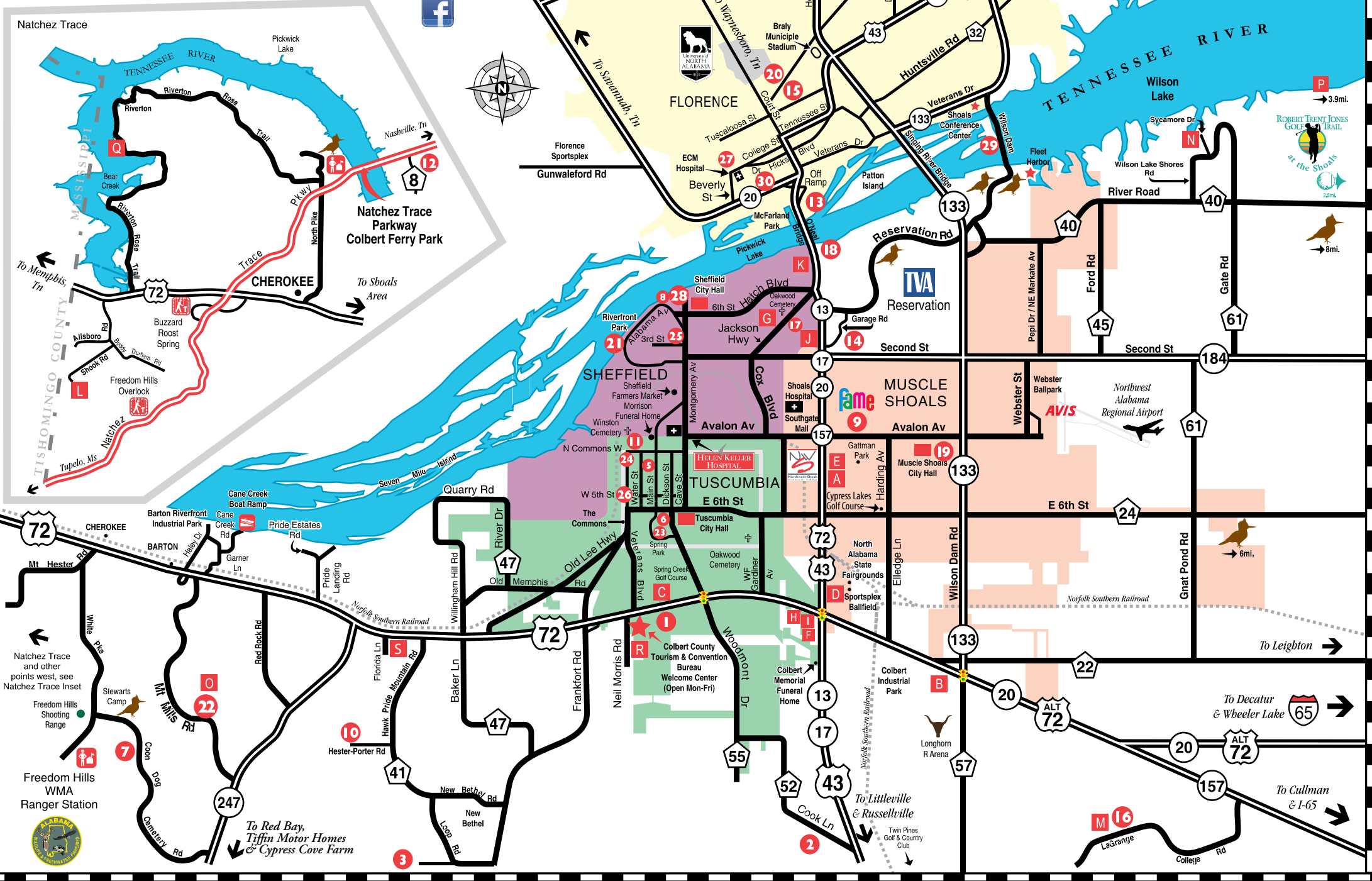
