The 50-mile-long lake has a surface area of 47,500 acres, that covers portions of Alabama, Mississippi, and Tennessee. Pickwick Lake has consistently ranked as the top bass lake in Alabama, surpassing renowned destinations like Guntersville Lake and Logan Martin Lake. With its diverse habitats, including swift water, grassy flats, deep ledges, rock bluffs, and gravel points, Pickwick Lake offers a prime fishing experience. Anglers can reel in trophy-sized largemouth, smallmouth, and spotted bass, as well as impressive blue catfish, striped bass, crappie, and bream. During winter, sauger fishing is popular near Wilson Dam, while big bass remain a prized catch year-round.

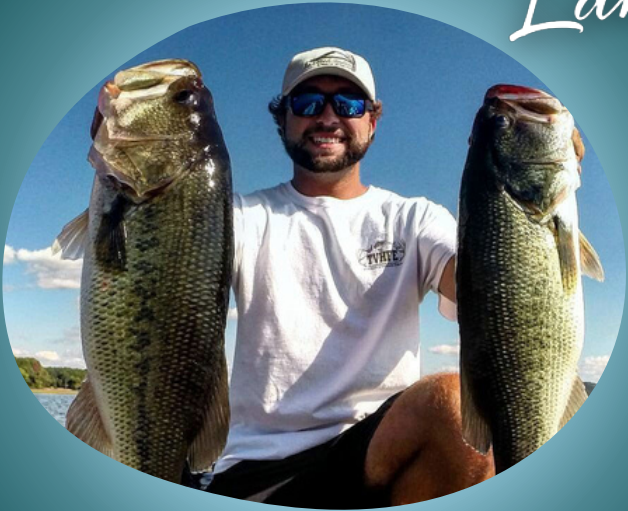

Wilson Lake, spanning 15,500 acres, may be smaller compared to other Tennessee Valley Authority lakes, but it is no stranger to producing impressive catches. Anglers frequently reel in largemouth bass exceeding 7 pounds, smallmouth bass weighing over 5 pounds, and blue catfish tipping the scales at more than 50 pounds. This lake offers a diverse fishing experience, with deep water in the lower sections and swift currents near Wheeler Dam.

Shallow sloughs are scattered throughout, allowing anglers to easily switch techniques and explore different types of structures without venturing far. Beyond the thrill of landing huge bass and catfish, Wilson Lake presents opportunities to fish for crappie, bream, sauger, and striped bass. Abundant boat ramps provide convenient access to all areas of the reservoir.
